We are a completely volunteer based, not-for-profit and community service charity organisation Background

Since 2000, through charitable donations and volunteer efforts, we have continued to fundraise and fund university-based PhD scholarships, small post graduate awards and more recently the LMRF Visiting Researcher Fellowships. These Fellowships are transformative bringing world renowned researchers to Adelaide for research partnerships.

Out in the field, from 2015 our highly visible skin cancer screening mobile unit provides a free community service with serious impact servicing from Darwin to Mt Gambier in the south. With an initial pick-up rate of 22% detected skin cancer lesions we save lives.

Every day, **6 Australians** die from skin cancer.

Over **26,141** individuals have been screened through LMRF roject.

2 out of every 3 Australians will be diagnosed with skin cancer



After screening **22.5%** Individuals were referred to general practitioners for further investigation.

4,894 people were identified with suspected life-threatening lesions requiring immediate medical attention.

Every year, millions of men and women worldwide die because of diseases that are, for the most part, significantly preventable. 74% of all deaths globally (41 million) were attributable to these non-communicable diseases (2023 World Health Organisation).
